В сборнике содержится необходимая информация для подготовки к сдаче международного квалификационного экзамена по языковой подготовке, состоящего из двух основных этапов: чтения текста и ответ на десять вопросов, прослушивание аудиотекста и составление рапорта по содержанию прослушанного аудиотеста.

Задания сборника ориентированы на формирование профессиональной иноязычной коммуникативной компетенции кандидатов для участия в миротворческих миссиях из числа сотрудников органов внутренних дел Российской Федерации и сотрудников органов внутренних дел африканских государств.

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INTRODUCTION

The language competency assessment is conducted in English and/or French. The language competency assessment consists of three parts: a) the reading comprehension exercise; b) the report writing exercise; and c) the assessment of oral communication skills that is part of the interview.

Reading comprehension exercise: The candidates receive a document describing an incident related to a United Nations peace operation. They have 20 minutes to read the document and answer 10 questions related to the incident. A candidate requires a minimum of seven (7) correct answers to pass the reading exercise. Scoring seven correct answers is equivalent to the required B1 level. The candidates may take notes while reading. The notes may be taken in any language and can be kept during the report writing exercise.

Report writing exercise: The candidates listen to an audio recording that provides additional information on the same incident. The candidates may take additional notes while listening. The notes may be taken in any language. The candidates have 30 minutes to write a comprehensive police report of the incident. The report should include and summarize all relevant facts of the incident. The spelling, grammar and style of the report will also be assessed based on the requirements of the B1 level.

CHAPTER 1. READING COMPREHENSION

Exercise № 1. HOME INVASION.

At 19.00 hrs. on Saturday 3 July 2011, a radio call was received from the station requesting that the station team, together with the local police, proceed to local address in Gbarnga City, following a complaint received by the resident. The station team, already on a monitoring mission in the area, immediately went to the said address, and met the resident Ms. Emilia Burudini. Ms. Burudini explained that at about 22.30 hrs. on Friday 2 July 2011, while she was alone and sleeping in her home, she was awakened by a knock on the door. As soon as she opened the door, two men forced their way into her house. She stated that after entering the house, they grabbed her and tied her to a chair. One of them started beating her in the face on several occasions, while the other one disappeared inside the house. The complainant is unable to provide much details or information regarding the identity or appearance of her aggressors. She stresses that one of them was wearing a military jacket. She also mentions that she could not understand the language used by the two men.

At 08.00 hrs. on Sunday 4 July 2011, the station team accompanied by local police visited the scene of the incident in order to meet with the complainant's husband, Mr. Mario Bosa, who was not present at the time of the team's first visit. Mr. Bosa explained that he was at his uncle's house when his wife was assaulted, and that when he returned home that night, he found his wife tied to the chair. He said she had a small bruise on her face, but didn't seem to have major injuries. They didn't report the incident to the police at that time since it was already late at night and they were both very tired.

At 09.00 hrs. on Monday 6 July 2011, the station team and local police visited Mr. Bosa's uncle, Mr. Gaby Luli. He confirmed that his nephew visited him on Friday night, 2 July 2011. He stated that they were together the whole evening, from 20.00 hrs. to 23.00 hrs. He said he doesn't understand why the police want to ask him these questions. He is always home, barely goes out, and was home that night. He is asking whether he is a suspect in the incident.

At 10.00 hrs, on Monday 6 July 2011, the station team accompanied by local police visited the complainant's neighbor, Mr. Busa Vudi. He stated that he was at home on the night of the incident, but didn't hear anything suspicious. He recalls seeing a blue vehicle parked in front of Ms. Burudini's house, but only for a few minutes. He didn't pay much attention and went to bed shortly after. He mentions that everybody in the area know that a good amount of money and some jewelries are kept in Ms. Burudini's house, and that he is not surprised at all this unfortunate incident happened.

On Wednesday 8 July 2011, a vehicle fitting the description provided by the complainant's neighbor was discovered on an abandoned field in Nimba area. Local police liaised and cooperated with Gbarnga city police in order to inspect the vehicle. Fingerprints were found inside the vehicle, analyzed, and allowed the identification of one suspect, who was later on brought to the police station for interrogation.

1. What was Ms. Burudini doing when she heard a knock on the door?
2. How many men were at the door?
3. What part of her body did one of the men hit when beating her?
4. What was wearing one of the suspects?
5. Could Ms. Burudini understand what the men were saying?
6. Where was Mr. Bosa the night of the event?
7. How long were Mr. Bosa and Mr. Luli together that night?
8. Can you describe the vehicle seen parked outside Ms. Burudini's house?
9. Where was the vehicle recovered?
10. What was found inside the vehicle?

Exercise № 2. UNV UNDER ATTACK.

It was reported that on 8 September 2012 at about 3.30 hrs. one United Nations Volunteer (UNV) working with the United Nations Organization Stabilization Mission in Democratic Republic of Congo (MONUSCO), named Francisco Da Silva Andrade of Timorese nationality who was serving in the Communication and Information Technology Section (CITS) in Goma, was wounded not far from his house in the Volcan neighborhood. The wound was caused by a bullet fired by an unknown person. In his initial statement to MONUSCO security investigators, that was recorded in the presence of United Nations Police (UNPOL), the victim said he left his home at 2.30 hrs. and went to a small shop near a night club to buy a prepaid telephone card in order to reply to a call from his wife. On his way back, he was followed and attacked by two individuals, including one armed with a pistol that shot him. The victim was rushed to MONUSCO Level-3 hospital where he underwent surgery. Luckily, his injury was not life threatening.

On 09 September, the victim was discharged from hospital and was sent home, located at 46 Sandy Road, Goma. MONUSCO security officer, Mr. James Frank visited him along with UNPOL Mary Jones to gather more information about the incident. The victim was asked to provide a detailed account of what happened. Mr. Andrade added to what he said earlier in his initial statement that, although the area where the night club is located is considered dangerous for UN staff, his intention was solely to purchase the prepaid phone card and return

home. He mentioned that, he first saw the two attackers at the shop but he did not give them any attention and headed home after purchasing the card. He added that the street lights were dim and there was hardly anybody around. He then felt that he was being followed and looked back only to realize that it was the same two individuals he saw earlier. The first one was about 30 years old, around 180 cm tall, had light skin, a thick moustache and beard and was wearing a black shirt and blue jeans. The second was around 20 years old, around 160 cm tall, had dark skin, a light beard and was wearing a military camouflaged shirt and green military-type pants. The shorter individual had a pistol in his hand. After realizing that they were noticed, both individuals ordered the victim to stop. He said that fearing for his life; he started running in the direction of his house. At that point, they threatened to shoot him if he did not comply. The victim ignored their threats and kept running. Shortly afterwards he heard a gunshot and felt sharp pain in his leg. He fell down on the ground screaming in grave pain.

During his statement, Mr. Andrade also mentioned that after he fell down to the ground, the attackers approached him and demanded that he gives them whatever amount of cash he had or they would kill him. The victim was in shock and begged them to spare his life. Given the circumstances, he gave them all the cash he had with him. He estimated the sum was about 150 US Dollars and also some amount of Congolese francs, but he was not sure about the exact quantity as he was under stress. The gunshot sound alerted the neighbors who rushed to see what had happened. The attackers panicked and ran off with the money. The victim added that he was bleeding heavily and was shouting for help. At that point, one neighbor, Mr. Qunicy Adams, who witnessed the shooting from his balcony overseeing the street, was the first to arrive to the scene. He called the police from his cell phone and passed the location and name of the victim in addition to a brief account of what had happened. The victim asked Mr. Adams to contact MONUSCO Security Office as well. After around 10 minutes, MONUSCO security officers arrived, and the police along with an ambulance. The medics noticed that the victim was beginning to lose consciousness due to the trauma and heavy loss of blood. The victim was then rushed to the MONUSCO hospital.

10. What is the name of the victim of the shooting?

Exercise № 3. KIDNAPPING – PROSTITUTION.

At 21.15 hrs. on Tuesday 5th March 2012, in the Prizren area, German KFOR along with an UNMIK police unit were on patrol when they found a young woman wearing a torn and dirty yellow dress lying in a ditch at the side of the road at grid reference 674-473. The young woman was very upset and had visible bruising to her face and arms and was bleeding from her wrists. The police officers spoke to the woman who told them that her name was “Maria” and that she was Goran. She added those four weeks ago, on the 14th of February 2012, she had been walking home to her family farm when a green Renault van had pulled up beside her. Three men got out of the van and had kidnapped her.

The Prizren Serious Crime Unit interviewed Maria. She stated three males, who all spoke Albanian, had kidnapped her. She described them as being about thirty years old and all were wearing dark clothing and black leather jackets. The leader of the kidnappers was approximately 150 cm tall, heavily built, black haired. He was armed with a large knife, which he held in his left hand. The second male was 180cm tall thin build, blonde haired and was wearing a red beret. The third male was also about 180cm tall; brown haired and was well built. When she had tried to run away, one of the men had grabbed her and punched her in the face and threw her into the back of the van. Her hands were tied behind her back, tape put over her mouth and a brown sack placed over her head. She was then driven to an unknown location, where she was beaten and raped by the leader. She then told how she had been sold to an Albanian man. His name was “Bekim“and he paid 2000 Euro for her. Maria had then been taken to a small house, a short distance from a bar just outside Prizren and forced to work as a prostitute. She had been kept locked in a store room in the house and her wrists were tied with a piece of rope when she was not working. Maria managed to untie her wrists and escape the previous night when “Bekim “was drunk. When she got out of the house she ran towards the road and fell into the ditch where KFOR found her. She described the Albanian by the name of “Bekim“as being about 50 years old, 180cm tall, with graying hair, and a gray mustache.

The Serious Crime Unit, along with KFOR, went to the Flamingo Bar at grid reference 675 318 and arrested the bar owner, who was identified as “Bekim“. A search of the bar resulted in, 1 x AK47, 2 x Smith and Wesson pistols and 25 rounds of ammunition being seized. During the search of the house, at grid 676 320, they found the pieces of blood-covered rope, which had been used to tie Maria. The seized items were turned over to the forensic section for

analysis. Bekim was brought before the Investigating Judge. The investigation is continuing.

In his first statement given for the Serious Crimes Unit, the owner of the bar "Bekim" denied all charges alleging that the three persons who brought Maria to work at his bar are from Prizren and they are well known to him as Businessmen. He added that they normally supply him with some stuff for the bar (Win, Water and some food). Bekim mentioned that he did not know that the girl was kidnapped by these three men, as when they brought her he was informed that she is one of their relatives who need a job to help her poor family. He also said that the 2000euro paid to the kidnappers was not for her but for some stuff, he bought from the kidnappers. Bekim also denied that he forced the girl to work as prostitute; he claimed that her job was as a waitress.

According to the information given by Bekim related to the identity of the kidnappers, the police checked their criminal records and found that they are serious criminals. the police was informed by a credible resource that they usually hide in a farm located about 5 km from Prizern, at grid reference 753-583 and they normally come to that place late evening to avoid being stopped by the police.

On 7th of March 2012 the police decided to conduct a sudden operation at 04:00 hrs. morning to arrest the three kidnappers and avoiding any resistance. The operation was conducted by the Serious Crime Unit Intervention Team, it lasted for one hour. Two of the suspects surrendered peacefully and the third was the leader who managed to escape from his room and started to shoot from his rifle, 30 minutes later, he was arrested after getting a bullet in his right leg and running out of ammunition. A large number of arms and stolen goods were found and seized from the place.

The three persons were interrogated by the serious crimes unit and admitted being involved with the kidnapping case of Maria and sold her to the owner of the bar for 2000 Euro, They also admitted being involved with other serious crimes like drug trafficking, theft and burglary. Later on and after being confronted with all evidences Bekim also admitted regarding his involvement with this case. Case is closed.

2. According to the first statement given by Bekim, what was the reason for accepting Maria to work in his bar?
3. According to the first statement given by Bekim, what was the job of Maria in the bar?
4. Why did the police decide to conduct the arrest operation in early morning time?
5. What was the time and date when the kidnappers were arrested by the police operation?
6. What was the grid reference of the place where the arrest operation took place?
7. What items did the police seize from the place where the Kidnappers were arrested?

8. How long did it take to arrest the kidnappers?
9. What did the criminal record verification of the kidnappers reveal?
10. What are the other crimes that the kidnappers admitted of their involvement in?

Exercise № 4. SHOOTING CASE.

At 04.15 hrs. on Friday 13 January 2012, a radio call was received from the station requesting immediate assistance at a shooting scene in Marina Village. Information received at that time indicated that a man was shot and killed at the scene, and that a local officer had been wounded and transported to the hospital. Two police officers from the station team immediately proceeded as requested to the scene.

Upon arrival at 04.27 hours, the officers observed that one man was shot dead and was lying on the ground. One off-duty local officer present at the scene, named Mentor, confirmed that the victim was trying to steal cows with his two accomplices and had been shot by a local police colleague during an exchange of gunfire. Mentor said that his colleague, named Fatbar, was also injured in the gunfire and has been transported to the hospital by ambulance. The body of the deceased was then taken to the mortuary for post-mortem examination.

At 05.30 hrs. on Friday 13 January 2012, the officers from the station team met with local officer Mentor. Mentor explained that he was off-duty when he heard noise outside his house. He woke up his colleague and roommate Fatbar, and they looked outside to see what was going on. They saw two cars: one “Opel Caravan” and one “Zastava truck”. It was dark outside so he was unable to read the plate numbers and couldn’t distinguish the color of the vehicles.

Mentor saw three individuals trying to load a cow in the truck. There were three cows already loaded. He went out of the house and said “Do not move, you’re under arrest”. One of the individual grabbed him, threw him on the ground and held him down, preventing him from moving or seeing anything. Mentor then heard five gun shots. A few minutes later the individual holding him fled and he was free to move again. When he got up, he saw that his colleague was wounded and that one of the suspects was lying dead on the ground.

At 06.30 hrs. on Friday 13 January 2012, while they were still at the scene of the incident, the officers from the station team were approached by a man saying he knows the dead suspect. He said the deceased is Ahmed Zahmed, a 48 year-old Marina Village man. He said Ahmed is the owner of the Zastava truck, which is red and old. He has no idea why Ahmed could have done something like that.

At 09.00 hrs. on Friday 13 January 2012, the officers from the station team went to the hospital to meet with the wounded local officer named Fatbar. Fatbar explained that when he and his colleague Mentor went outside to appre-

hend the suspects, one of the individual grabbed a hunting rifle from the Opel Caravan and fired two shots at him. He received one bullet in his left leg. He then pointed his gun at the shooter, shot and killed him. The two other thieves immediately got into their vehicles and drove away. Officer Fatbar fired two more shots in the direction of the vehicles as they left.

Fatbar mentioned that officer Mentor couldn't see anything that happened since he was held on the ground by one suspect, and couldn't move until the suspects finally escaped. When Mentor got up and saw his wounded colleague, he called an ambulance and Fatbar was transported to the hospital for medical treatment.

At 10.00 hrs. on Friday 13 January 2012, the officers from the station team met with another off-duty local officer that came to the hospital to visit his wounded colleague. His name is Menar. He explained that he knows the dead suspect, who has been involved in numerous serious crimes in the past 3 years. He usually commits his crimes with two accomplices, and they all live in Marina Village. They usually drive around in a red Zastava truck, with the plate number 573NK276. Menar says he got scared when he learned that his colleague had been shot, but he is relieved to see that his injuries are not too serious, that he will be fine and back to work soon.

Exercise № 5. TRAFFIC FATALITY CASE.

At 13.35 hours on Thursday 8 March 2011, Torco Village Police received a telephone report of a Traffic Accident on Lion Street, Grid Reference 12/443. A police patrol unit was immediately dispatched, arriving at 13.47 hours, with emergency medical services arriving at the scene at the same time as the police. Preliminary investigation revealed that a Blue Ford Sierra, registration plate number T171 OHM was traveling north on Lion Street, towards the Torco Village Square, when a female ran out of a yard from the right side of the street into the path of the vehicle. The force of the collision with the female knocked her female into the air, and then she crashed into the front windshield of the vehicle

before rolling off and landing on the roadway. Medics pronounced the female dead at the scene and the body was transported to the medical center morgue in Montblanc for autopsy. The driver of the Ford sustained injuries to his head and chest and was transported by ambulance to Mercy Hospital. The Ford Sierra was taken to the Police Station garage for further examination.

Two witnesses told officers that the victim was in her front yard cleaning her walkway when they heard a dog barking angrily. They then saw a large brown dog come from the side of the house and leap at the woman. She began to scream and ran down the walkway into the road. A car was coming down the street at that moment, and the driver tried to swerve but struck the victim with the right front of the car before crashing into a pole on the opposite side of the street. The first witness was identified as Susanna Reno, who stated that everything happened so fast that there was nothing the driver could do to prevent the accident. The second witness was identified as Joseph Wise, who stated that they have had a recent problem with packs of wild dogs terrorizing the neighborhood, chasing children and adults alike. Investigators requested that the Police Control Room notify Animal Control of the report of wild dogs. Investigations are continuing.

Reference is made to a case reported on 8 March 2011. On 8 March 2011 at 14.07 hours, investigators from the Fatality Accident Investigation Unit arrived on the scene. Further analysis determined several additional factors relative to this incident. Measurements were taken to establish key distances to relative items. The front door of the victim's home is a distance of 4 meters from the edge of the street. The paved surface of the street is 3.3 meters across. This is a one way street with traffic direction north toward Torco Village Square. The maximum speed limit is 30 kph. The path of the vehicle swerved to the left after striking the victim, traveling a distance of 6 meters from point of impact before crashing into a light pole at 14 Lion Street. There were no skid marks. Investigations are continuing.

Reference is made to a case reported on 8 March 2011. On 9 March 2011 at 0940 hours, a post mortem medical examination was conducted on the deceased. The victim was Francine Morales, born 22 December 1977, residing at 17 Lion Street. Examination revealed that she had died of multiple massive fractures to the head and upper body as a result of being struck by the car, causing immediate death. Additionally, the examination concluded that the victim had scratches and a severe animal bite to the calf of her right leg.

Reference is made to a case reported on 8 March 2011. Mr. Manuel was in stable condition at Mercy Hospital recovering from his injuries. He sustained two broken ribs from the force of the airbag deploying, and he has numerous cuts on his face and hands from glass fragments from the shattered windshield. He will be interviewed as soon as the doctor gives permission.

Judicial authorities have determined no criminal charges will be filed against the driver as a result of this traffic fatality incident.

8. What was the arrival time of the emergency medical services?
9. Where was the dead body taken?
10. What was the registration of the Ford Sierra?

Exercise № 6. PRISTINA MURDER CASE.

At 01.05 hrs. on Wednesday 11 October 2010, Pristina Control received an anonymous telephone call reporting shots fired and a woman screaming for help. Pristina Control contacted Regional Murder Squad Investigator Jean PAIN at 0106 hours and relayed the message of a drive-by shooting in Dragodan, Pristina, Grid Reference 125/230. Investigator PAIN arrived at the scene at 01.15 hours and discovered that the victim had already been taken by ambulance to Pristina hospital. Investigator PAIN spoke with the wife of the victim, Fetija GASHI. Mrs. Gashi was extremely upset and wanted to be taken to the hospital to be with her husband. She identified the victim of the shooting as Arden GASHI, born 20 March 1929. She reported that she and her husband had been walking along the street when a dark brown vehicle drove by them, without any lights on. She could only remember the letters KS from the registration plate on the vehicle. She started screaming for help, and a police patrol and ambulance arrived to the scene. She said the ambulance made some emergency medical procedures to stabilize her husband and then took him to the hospital. No other witnesses were located. At 01.18 hours, Officer PAIN made a request to Pristina Control to contact the Forensic Identification Unit and the Investigative Judge to respond to the scene. Both units were immediately contacted by Pristina Control at 01.18 hours. AT 01.31 hours, Pristina Control advised Investigator PAIN that the emergency room doctor reported that Mr. Gashi was pronounced dead on arrival at the hospital at 01.30 hours.

Reference is made to a case reported on 11 October 2010. The Forensic Identification Unit and the Investigative Judge each arrived at the scene at 01.30 hours. Two empty 7.56 cartridges were recovered at the scene of the shooting, and then the area was sealed for further examination to be conducted in daylight. Pristina Control broadcast details of the suspect vehicle to all units. The regional

commander for investigations and the station commander were also informed of the situation.

Reference is made to a case reported on 11 October 2010. On 11 October 2010, at 01.45 hours a police patrol saw the suspected vehicle, a brown Opel Kadett, travelling on the Skopje Road out of Pristina and it was stopped at the Swedish Kosovo Forces (KFOR) checkpoint, Grid Reference 123/201. The police officers in cooperation with the Swedish KFOR troops searched the three male occupants and the vehicle. The registration number of the Opel Kadett was 372 KS 573. No firearms were found, however four empty 7.56 cartridges were recovered from the rear passenger area of the vehicle. The vehicle was impounded at Police Station Number 1 in Pristina. On the authorization of the Investigative Judge, the three male occupants were arrested on suspicion of murder and taken to the Detention Centre, Pristina. At the direction of the commander for investigations, two additional investigators were being called in to assist in the interviews of the multiple suspects.

Reference is made to a case reported on 11 October 2010. On 11 October 2010, at 02.15 hours the Investigative Judge attended the Mortuary, Pristina Hospital, where the body of Arden GASHI was examined. The medical examination revealed three gunshot wounds to the chest, two which penetrated the left lung and one which passed through the heart; death was instantaneous and was caused by the shot through the heart. Following the post-mortem examination, the Investigative Judge authorized the release of the body for burial. The wife of the victim will be able to claim the victim's property on the next working day. Investigations are continuing.

Reference is made to a case reported on 11 October 2010. On 11 October 2010, at 09.00 hrs, the three arrested suspects were interviewed by investigators. Ismail ALTI, born 21 August 1974 confessed to the shooting of Mr. GASHI. Charged as accessories were the driver, Mehmet BALUSHI, born 14 May, 1977, and his brother Mergim BALUSHI, born 27 June 1979. All remain in the Pristina Detention Centre, pending court appearances.

Exercise № 7. STABBING INCIDENT AT GARAGE.

On Monday 5 May 2003, at 10.00 hours, a stabbing incident was reported to the Police Station # 6. The caller stated that the incident had occurred in the garage that was located at grid reference 153-478. Immediately, a police patrol was dispatched to the scene of the incident.

On arrival at the scene of the incident at 10.15 hours the officers observed, that the 50-year-old male garage owner was lying bleeding on the floor in the garage. He had been stabbed a number of times in the left side of his chest. Due to the very serious condition of the garage owner's wounds the officers decided to immediately transport the victim by ambulance to the local hospital for treatment.

The twenty two year old male witness to the incident said that at 09.45 hours, while he was 20 meters away from the incident, he observed the garage owner and the offender. It was a male about forty years of age, 185 cm tall, very slim build, with black hair, dressed in blue jeans costume, white shirt and black shoes, arguing loudly with the garage owner.

The argument was concerning the 450-euro repair cost that he was being charged on his yellow, van type vehicle, license # 273-KS-846. The witness then stated that he observed the offender removed a knife from his pocket with his right hand and stab the garage owner in the chest three times, and then put the knife back in his pocket.

Further interview of the witness revealed that he was the unemployed nephew of the garage owner and resided at the Airport Street -39, grid reference 256-384.

The witness stated that he had never seen the offender in the garage before the incident occurred. The witness also added that the offender, after having stabbed the garage owner 3 times, drove away at a very high speed from the garage in the north direction.

The witness further advised that as the offender was getting into his vehicle he noticed that he had bloodstains on his white shirt and on the jacket.

The officers proceeded to the local hospital to interview the victim of the stabbing and to obtain further information about the identity of the offender. Upon arrival at the local hospital the attending doctor advised the officers, that the victim was not awake and was unable to speak with them for several days due to his very serious condition.

The doctor gave the telephone number of the hospital as 516-832 and told the officers that they could telephone the hospital and enquire about the condition of the victim no earlier than the next morning.

The investigation into the incident of the stabbing is continuing.

The witness was asked to come to the police station for an interview the same day.

The following conversation is the dialogue between the police officer and the witness of this incident.

Exercise № 8. BOMB BLAST INCIDENT IN SOUTHERN BAGHDAD AREA.

On 25th of June, 2011 at about 15.30 hrs. an unknown phone caller informed to ISF (International Stabilization Force) station in Baghdad Headquarters that there was a bomb blast incident happened in Southern Baghdad area. The duty officer of the station was 1st lieutenant Hans Muller a German national. After receiving the information he informed the matter to the station commander Lt. Colonel Roser Muller the same nationality. He directed the duty officer to send a patrol team immediately. After five minutes the duty officer dispatched a patrol team consisting of ten NATO military personnel headed by Major Ramos a German national excluding the military driver with an APC.

The team reached the scene after forty nine minutes of their departure from the station. It is only twenty five minutes way but due to heavy traffic jam and off road they need that time. As the team reached the scene, they cordon the area with red tape and called for five ambulances from the ISF headquarters through their military radio. They picked the injured persons and send them at ISF military hospital, Baghdad. They picked 93 persons including one-third women and children. At about 20.20 hrs. while they were coming back to their station one third ways they became attacked by some sniper.

The sniper fired to them by using automatic rifle, light machine gun and also thrown some grenades. NATO personnel also backed fired to the sniper by using APC's machine gun. After fighting fifteen minutes the sniper also lunched a rocket to their APC and it damage of the right front side. Two NATO soldiers died in spot and three were injured. The team leader also sent this message to their station. Two NATO helicopters also come there to protect them and fired three missiles to the sniper's building at GR: 256-459. The building fully

damaged and got fired. Later NATO ground forces searched the area and see five dead bodies of the snipers. There were two women there.

The injured NATO personnel also sent to NATO military hospital in Baghdad through helicopter. After that the team backed to their station at 22.20 hrs. and made a report of those two incidents.

One eye witness informed to the team that a suicide attacker blew up a bomb-filled car at a police station south of Baghdad, killing 51 people including 21 police men on the same day, as Iraqi forces braced for Al-Qaeda revenge attacks after Osama bin Laden's death. The attack, which also wounded at least 51 policemen, was the worst in Iraq in more than a month, and pushed security chiefs to install new checkpoints, tighten access to key roads and restrict movement between provinces.

The bombing left a two meter crater and badly damaged the police station in the center of the mainly Shiite sector area in Baghdad town, in addition to several nearby houses and shops, just days after US Special Forces killed bin Laden at Attobabad in Pakistan. "The suicide bomber took advantage of the police station's guards changing shift to attack," said Haider al Zazour, head of the Baghdad provincial council security committee. "He managed to drive through the main gate and blew up his vehicle four meters inside the station's perimeter."

On the following day the chief of ISF hospital put the toll from yesterday's suicide bombing at 51 dead and 93 wounded, of them 21 policemen. Of the wounded, 30 were in serious condition, the doctor Alim al-Ali said, speaking on condition of anonymity. The death toll was confirmed by a list of the fatalities posted inside the hospital. Later at midnight eight people died in the hospital that was serious injured including three policemen.

Iraqi Taliban leader Mustafa Omar claimed from an anonymous place that, they were responsible for those two attacked. The following day at about 08/00 hrs. of the incident local police discovered two dead bodies of two policemen from 1st the scene and one more body from the second scene.

At 21.45 hours on Wednesday 16th March 2011 the United Nation police (UNPOL) patrol Alpha 345, with UNPOL officer Ms. Ann Smith and Mr. David Hudson, was conducting a joint patrol with two Liberian national police (LNP) patrols, Tango 67 and sierra 85, in the northern part of central Monrovia at 34 Dexter street, patrol Alpha 345 noticed that a group of young men, all aged about 20 years old, were gathered. They seemed to be involved in an intense discussion. One of the men, significantly taller than the others and dressed in a red leather jacket, seemed to be very aggressive. Alpha 345 stopped to find out what was going on and informed the two LNP patrols over the radio, describing the aggressive man. When Alpha 345 stopped, the group of men fled the spot and ran away in different directions, and by the time the two UNPOL's had parked their car, there was no one left on the street corner. The UNPOL's found two violet sized plastic bags with a small amount of white powder, suspiciously narcotic, which were both left on the pavement. Alpha345 cordoned off the scene and reported over the radio to the National Operation Center (NOC) asking for assistance.

At 22.15 hours LNP dog patrol, K9-21 arrived at the scene to make a search for drugs the dog was immediately marking for narcotics on the spot where the two plastic bags had been found. Continuing the search, the dog showed interest in some flower pots placed outside 34 Dexter Street and was finally marking on one of them. When the dog handler took a closer look, she discovered something hidden in the pot, under the flower. There was a shoe box containing 500 US dollars and approximately 50 small plastic bags some with white powder and some with small pieces of dried leaves the box with its contents was seized.

While the crime scene was searched, patrol Tango 67 reported over the radio that they saw a young man running along the street, whose description was well fitting of the description of the man Alpha 456 had earlier seen at the crime scene, wearing a red leather jacket. When the man saw the police patrol he speeded too and it was obvious that he tried to get away from the police patrol. Because of the development at the crime scene, Tango 67 decided to arrest the fleeing man. Tango 67 was able to block his way of escape with their car. The LNP patrol ordered him to stop but it was not until the police officers physically grabbed him, did he actually stop. The police officers then needed to keep him lying on the ground to prevent him from fleeing. He struggled to break loose from them and threatened to cut their throats if they did not let him go. Tango 67 arrested the suspected for a drug crime and took him to the nearest police station, Delta 33.

Patrol K9-21 kept searching the area where the group of men had gathered. In the building located at the address 34 Dexter Street, a three-floor apart-

ment building where three families were living, the dog showed interest in the stairs leading from the main entrance of the house to the street. The dog finally marked on the first stair from the street. Under this stair, a second shoe box containing 330 US dollars was found. There were also a few small plastic bags in the box. The plastic bags were empty, but there were traces of white powder in all of them. There was small Beretta revolver of caliber 5mm under the shoe box. The revolver was loaded.

Meanwhile, patrol sierra 85 arrived at 34 Dexter Street to assist patrol K9-21. The patrol was immediately approached by Mr. Alan Fox, who was living at 34 Dexter Street. This evening, like most evenings, he had been sitting with some other neighbors at the outdoor café "The Anchor", located at 32 Dexter Street where there was a good view over 34 Dexter Street and its surroundings. According to Mr. Fox, 34 Dexter Street had been the meeting place for selling and buying narcotics for the last three years. Mr. Fox and his neighbors were very concerned about the activities going on at 34 Dexter Street. Some of them had witness that the persons involved in these drug transactions had been armed and the people living in the neighbors feared that sooner or later someone was going to get seriously hurt.

Exercise № 10. PROTEST.

On 12 December 2012 at 15.25 the Bong County Police received a telephone call reporting a roadblock in the area of Gbanga (Grid reference 115/125). Police patrol Bravo-2 responded to the scene, arriving at 16.00 hours, finding a large number of people gathered on the Gbanga Highway. There was a barricade formed on the highway made of rocks, stones and wrecked cars. The mob was shouting, throwing stones and fighting against several soldiers of Armed Forces of Liberia (AFL). As a response to this situation, at 16.30 hours, the Liberian National Police (LNP) and United Nations Police (UNPOL) including United Nations Formed Police Unit (FPU) were deployed to the scene with orders to clear the road. As soon as the road had been cleared by the police, the protesters built up another barricade across the highway. At 18.45 hours, after some clashes, deployed police forces managed to disperse the rioters and the highway was reopened. No arrest was made and no major injuries reported. The police estimated the number of protestors to be approximately five hundred.

Reference is made to the incident reported on 12 December 2012. The investigation regarding the unrests was launched by the Bong County Police. It revealed that the rioters were predominantly angry youth who joined commercial motorcyclists, all members of the Iron Gate Community. They launched the protest in response to an incident involving a motorcycle taxi driver and an AFL soldier. This incident took place the same day but shortly before the riots, around 13.30 hours. Reportedly, a young female hired a taxi motorcyclist, a member of Iron Gate Community in Gbanga, to drop her at her house. Upon arrival, however, she refused to pay for the ride. As the taxi driver insisted on payment, the female passenger called her boyfriend, an AFL soldier, who arrived at the scene and attacked the motorcyclist. He beat him up and left him on the street unconscious and bleeding. Then, the perpetrator and his girlfriend ran away from the scene. The victim was rushed to the hospital after an anonymous phone call was made to the emergency services.

Reference is made to the incident occurred on 12 December 2012. On 13 December 2012 investigators of the Bong County Police identified six persons who allegedly took part in the road block of Gbanga Highway after reviewing the video files of the riots recorded by the police. The LNP police officers, who had been assaulted by the mob at the scene, also recognized the attackers. Their identity was established on the basis of intelligence gathered by investigators. All the suspects were arrested and questioned by the investigators. They confessed to attending the protest but denied attacking the police officers. A prosecuting judge authorized the suspects to be charged with assault of the police officers and participation in an illegal gathering. They were held in the Bong detention center.

Reference is made to the case reported on 12 December 2012. Police investigators established the victim of the AFL soldier attack which triggered the unrests and the roadblock on Gbanga Highway. He was identified as 25-year old Mr. Joshua Bundu, a member of Iron Gate Community living on 25 Ribbon Street in Gbanga, and working as a motorcycle taxi driver. After the assault, he was transported to the Gbanga Municipal Hospital. The medical examination revealed that he had a cut on his left shoulder and forehead. No other injuries were discovered. After delivery of first aid by the doctors, he was released from the hospital.

Both local and nationwide media reported the unrests which occurred on 12 December 2012 in Gbanga. It was reported that the protest was targeting AFL soldiers. The media emphasized that the Iron Gate Community decided to protest on the street in order to attract the attention of the government and to make them address the behavior of AFL soldiers and their impunity over recent reported assaults against local citizens. Journalists stressed that recently there were five similar assaults reported to the police in connection to the AFL. In none of these cases was there a suspect established, convicted, sentenced, or punished. According to the commentators, this situation made a clear message to the society that AFL soldiers are above the law.

At 10.05 hours, 5 January 2012 United Nations Police Officers (UNPOLs) received information from the local police concerning an attempted escape by the inmates in Man Prison on the evening of 4 January 2012 at around 18.00 hours. UNPOL visited the scene and found out the following information. The prisoners, totaling 24, who had just finished eating their dinner, managed to take two prison guards hostage. These two guards were locked in a place called “hot cell”. Fifteen prisoners were able to climb the wall and sneak out of the courtyard. Four guards posted at the reception area noted that the prisoners came out of the courtyard trying to reach the main exit door. These guards alerted the other four guards posted outside the prison building. With their AK47 assault rifles, the guards outside were able to keep the prisoners back, inside the common courtyard. Then, the guards who were locked in the “hot cell” were released. Two prisoners were injured during this incident.

UNPOL patrol 2830 visited the scene at 11.00, 5 January 2012. They met with the guards who had been involved in the attempted escape. The two who had been taken hostage and locked in “hot cell” said that three of the prisoners had been armed with what looked like homemade knives that they used to threaten the guards with. The three armed prisoners seemed to take the lead in the attempted escape, giving orders to the other prisoners. They were easy to recognize, as all three had big tattoos of a lion with wings on the upper part of their left arm. These three prisoners did not seem to fear any type of violent actions. They noted that the other prisoners also seemed to be afraid of the three lead prisoners. In fact, when one of the prisoners refused to lock the door to the “hot cell” one of the lead prisoners, cut his neck.

UNPOL patrol 2830 made a follow-up visit to Man Prison at 11.30 hours, 6 January 2012 to check whether the prison management had taken necessary actions to prevent any further attempted escapes. Several actions had been taken by the management. First, the prison guard team leader explained that all 50 cells in the prison had been searched through and a lot of weapons in different shapes had been seized. All 250 prisoners had been body searched with a negative result. Then the wall where the prisoners had climbed had been covered with barbed wire.

It was noted that none of the prison guards who were involved (two taken hostage, four posted in the reception area and four posted outside) had been injured physically. The two guards taken hostage were still in shock. They were taken off normal duty and given administrative duties. The prison doctor was keeping these two guards under observation and checking their mental condition

regularly. UNPOL patrol also visited the hospital in Man Prison to check the condition of a prisoner who was hospitalized after the attempted escape. He broke his leg after falling from the wall. His injury was not life threatening. He had no complaints concerning his treatment in the hospital.

At 09.00 hours, 7 January 2012 the prison manager, Ms. Susan Doe, informed UNPOL that they had identified the three prisoners who lead the attempted escape. Their names were Mr. Joseph Brill, Mr. Alan Dublett and Mr. Georg Claude and are all well-known robbers from the Abidjan area. They are all members of a gang called the “Flying Lions”. They had leading roles among the other prisoners and have been feared, both by prison staff and inmates. Most of the weapons seized after the attempted escape, were found in the cells of these three men, in total nine. With their criminal network they could easily plan an escape and by threaten the other prisoners for this purpose. These three prisoners were put in isolation cells in Man Prison at 18.00 hours, 7 January, to prevent any further tries to escape and to calm the fears of the other inmates.

A patrol unit was sent to the restaurant and arrived at 21.24 hours. The restaurant owner directed them to a back room of the restaurant, where they found a body of a male person lying on the floor. Beside the body was a table covered with playing cards, appearing that there had been a game of cards in progress at the time of the shooting. A check of the body revealed that he had received three gunshot wounds to the body and ambulance personnel declared him dead at the scene. The owner stated that the victim was playing poker

in the back room, along with the owner, the dead man, the suspect and two other men. He identified the dead man as Goran Brown, who had been having a lucky day at cards, winning several thousand Euros until he became involved in an argument with one of the other players, only know by his first name, Dan. Dan accused Goran of being a cheat; Goran hit Dan several times with his fists. Suddenly Dan pulled out a pistol and shot Goran and then ran away. Dan was described as about 20 years old, 1.75 meters tall, had short brown hair, and dressed in blue jeans and a gray pullover shirt.

The owner of the restaurant was interviewed, who stated that Dan fired a gun, and then ran from the building. A further search of the room revealed two fresh bullet holes in the card table. These two bullets were recovered from the table for forensic examination. No empty cartridges were found at the scene; therefore it was suspected that the weapon used was a revolver. The restaurant owner remembered Dan talking about the old car he was driving, that it needed repairs, and that he lost a lot of money.

Reference is made to a case reported on 18 July 2011. An autopsy was performed on the murder victim, identified as Goran BROWN, born on 17 January 1968 and living at 12 Main Avenue, Mountain City. The autopsy revealed that he had been shot three times, once in the chest and three times in the arm. Death was instantaneous from the gunshot to the chest. Three bullets were recovered from the body and placed into evidence. The Investigative Judge authorized release of the body to the family for funeral arrangements.

Reference is made to a case reported on 18 July 2011. On 18 July at 22.00 hours, an additional witness, Marta James, who lived next to the restaurant in a house at 210 Oak Road, came forward and stated that at 21.20 hours she heard five gunshots from the direction of the restaurant. She then saw a man running to a car parked next to her house. She saw him throw something away. She could hear loud noise from the muffler as the suspect drove away toward North Road.

Reference is made to a case reported on 18 July 2011. On 18 July 2011, at 22.10 hours, officers conducted a search of the street where the Volvo had been parked. A Smith and Wesson .38 caliber revolver, serial number SW98765, was found by the light post. There was one live .38 round and five empty .38 cartridges in the chambers. Officers took the weapon into their custody and notified the Investigative Judge and investigating police officers. The weapon was placed in Property and Evidence. The Smith and Wesson .38 Special was traced to the owner, David Green. No further information was forthcoming, investigations are continuing.

Reference is made to a case reported on 18 July 2011. On 19 July 2011, at 10.10 hours Ballistic tests were conducted on the Smith and Wesson .38 Special. Ballistic Tests confirmed that it was the same weapon as used in the mur-

der. Shortly after, the suspect came to the police station on 19 July 2011 at 11.00 hours, and was interviewed. The suspect stated that he had been gambling for several hours, and had lost money that he was supposed to pay bills with. He admitted that he shot the victim because he was angry and afraid about not having the money to pay his bills. Investigative Judge ordered his arrest and detention at the Mountain City jail.

Exercise 3. BURGLARY AT BERISHA STREET.

First part (Reading)

At 06.45 hours on Tuesday, 29 October 2011 “Police Control” received a telephone call from a local man, who said that he believed a burglary had just occurred at Berisha Street # 67. No casualties were reported during the phone call. A police Patrol team from North Police Station was dispatched to the scene.

Reference is made to a case reported on 29 October 2011. The witness was waiting on Berisha Street near the burglarized house as the Police patrol arrived at the scene. The offices of the International Organization of Migration (IOM) are located in that house. The witness said that he was visiting his friend’s house nearby. At approximately 6.30 hrs. he heard strange hammering sounds and looked out of the window. Then he went out into his friend’s yard and saw one of the windows of the IOM office broken and the door open. He saw the silhouettes of people inside and he went back into the house to call the police. He also stated that he saw a light colored car parked near the house. He was not sure about the registration number of the car and was not certain about its color as it was quite dark.

The driver of the Police patrol car said that he had passed a light colored “Opel Omega” car with no registration plates with several people in it. It was heading in the opposite direction towards the airport. The leader of the patrol team got in touch with “Police Control” and asked the airport police to look for

a light colored “Opel Omega” car and detain it for further investigation if they locate it. The witness said that he knows the director of the IOM office, a woman named Marla Orman. He had her business card. The leader of the patrol team contacted Ms. Marla Orman and asked her to come to her office to identify what was missing in the building.

Reference is made to a case reported on 29 October 2011. The Airport police reported that at 07.20 hrs. a silver colored “Opel Omega” with no registration plates was stopped and two laptops, two digital cameras, one DVD player, one printer and two scanners in the trunk of the car were found. The driver, a young male, was not able to prove that these items belonged to him. During an interview he said that there had been two other passengers in the car, who had just got out. The driver confirmed that these two men were with him in the IOM building and they had stolen the electronic equipment together. The driver was detained by police.

Reference is made to a case reported on 29 October 2011. Ms. Orman, the director of the IOM, arrived at the scene at 07.30 hours. She checked the offices and made a list of missing equipment. Ms. Orman explained that IOM uses metal identification tags screwed into the bottom of their equipment. The tags have IOM logo and bar codes with serial numbers, and she gave the police a list of all the equipment. According to her, the total value of missing items was 4,320 US dollars. The items found in the trunk of the vehicle matched the items listed on the IOM inventory register and therefore the Police station north retained them until the completion of the investigation. Ms. Orman also stated that she found that two more scanners and a desktop computer had been disconnected and moved from their original places. They had been put on a table by the door. Forensics processed for fingerprints and IOM retained these items.

Reference is made to a case reported on 29 October 2011. Upon completion of the interview with Ms. Orman, police officers had started searching for any eye-witnesses of the incident in the area. They were able to take a statement from one of the neighbors who identified himself as Mr. Kalu Odege, a former UN employee residing at Berisha Street # 64. He stated that he heard some noise and the sound of a car engine around 6.30 in the morning. However, he could not provide any more details as he was lying in bed at that early time and did not look outside.

Exercise 4. DECOMPOSING BODY.

First part (Reading)

At 07:43 hrs, on Friday, 19 July 2013 members of "Club de Pétion-Ville" in Pétion-Ville made a phone call to the Pétion-Ville Police Station complaining of a stinking smell conforming to decomposing bodies. The smell was distinctly dissimilar to the smell coming from the nearby sausage plant. A team of experts including UNPOL investigators and SWAT was dispatched which reached the location at 07:50 hrs. to begin with the search for smelly object and to investigate into the incident. At around 08:05 hrs. the police team, with the assistance of cadaver- smelling dogs, discovered a dead body in a bag wrapped in plastic, covered by a bush, about 150 feet from a garage behind an apartment building, in a field. The investigating police at the scene had difficulty determining the body was female due to the state of advanced decomposition. The Police and the community members continued to search in the abandoned homes which resulted in the discovery of two other female bodies that appeared to have been thrown through one of the windows into the basement of an abandoned house. After two more bodies were found in the Petion-Ville area (bringing the total up to three homicides in a single day), Mayor Gary Norman came to the scene along with representatives from multiple bureaus and organizations. All three victims were found with no ID but were black females. The first discovered was dressed in a green hoodie with a pink and green orchid tattoo on her left thigh. The second woman was wearing a leopard print purple top and the third wore a green jacket and had a pink orchid tattoo on her hip. The state of decomposition of the bodies indicated that all three females had been killed within six to ten days.

At 10:15 hrs. the bodies were taken to the local Pétion-Ville hospital for medical examination in order to determine their identity and cause of death. Due to the level of decomposition, the Police contemplated the use of DNA for identification. Three crime scene vehicles and an evidence recovery team arrived to check the open lot and the checking continued until late evening. Evidence technicians analyzed the area for hours but discovered nothing.

The Pétion-Ville County Medical Examiner Thomas Gilson identified the first of the three women as being Angela Deskins believed to be 32-years-old. His office continued the investigation to establish the causes of death and the

identities of the other two women. All three victims had the same modus operandi leading back to 35-year-old Michael Madison, a registered sex offender. The MOs of these serial homicides looked very similar to that of convicted serial killer Anthony Sowell who has been serving a 15-year prison sentence since 2005. Police interviewed Ms. Lori Norman, Anthony's girlfriend but retrieved no clues. Police also interviewed Madison's former girl-friend, Emy Fortson, 31, who stated that she felt unsafe shortly after she began dating Madison. When she tried to end the relationship, he threatened her several times by pointing a gun at her head asking if she wanted to die. In one situation, he bound her hands and feet with a tie and a belt, and gagged her with a rag to the point of almost unconsciousness. She choked and her body tingled before she freed herself. She said Madison regularly changed his women and some of them have been reported missing from the neighborhood. She admitted that she felt guilty for not speaking up sooner. Nathenia Crosby, 48, said that Madison was her neighbor who frightened her because of his obsession with her daughter.

Police used warrants to search the garage and the apartment across the alley around Michael Madison's apartment. Around 16:30 hrs. on Saturday, 20th July 2013, the SWAT and investigating police officers got involved in a stand-off with a suspect in the homicide of the three females whose bodies were found about 100 to 200 yards apart in Pétion-Ville. The suspect was tracked by the Police to his mother's house, located at the corner of E. 197th Street and Saint Martin Boulevard in Pétion-Ville near the Cite Soleil border. The Investigating Team Leader UNPOL Carla Rees used a bullhorn to persuade Michael Madison to surrender but he did not. Finally, after breaking down the door, the Police arrested Madison at 17:00 hrs. without incident. A bystander at the scene said that Madison seemed to have something on his mind but appeared to still be a normal guy.

UNPOL Investigators and the SWAT officers took Madison in for questioning for his suspected involvement in the Pétion-Ville homicide. Suspicion of Madison's involvement was compounded by the fact that he was a registered sex offender, who had spent time in prison and that the dead bodies were found near his apartment building.

Exercise 5. FIGHT ON AN INCOMING TRAIN.

First part (Reading)

At approximately 02:00 hrs. on 01 January 2009, Police Station # 2 responded to reports from an unidentified person that up to 12 people were involved in a fight on an incoming train from the Paynesville - ELWA Low Station. The participants were drunk and stoned. Special Police Unit (SPU) officers Joseph Alba and Tony Pirone of the Liberian National Police (LNP) officers rushed immediately to the scene. They removed Grant from the train along with several other men suspected of fighting and detained them on the platform of Low Station. Pirone handcuffed Grant's friend which angered other passengers. Pirone then lined Grant and two other men up against the wall. Pirone confirmed with the train operator that the men detained were involved in the fight. Officer Pirone directed Officer Joseph Alba to arrest two of the individuals who had not been handcuffed, one of whom was Oscar Grant. On hearing Officer Pirone's direction to Joseph Alba, Grant attempted to stand up, but was forced to the ground face first. Both Officer Alba and Officer Pirone attempted to restrain Mr. Grant and to seek his compliance by ordering him to put his hands behind his back, but Mr. Grant resisted and refused to submit to being handcuffed. Officer Alba was pulling on Mr. Grant's right arm, which remained under his torso near his waist. Mr. Grant had not been searched by any officer for weapons, either prior to his initial detention or after being seated near the wall. During the restraint with Grant, Officer Alba stood and, according to witnesses, said: "Get back, I'm gonna tase him." Officer Alba then un-holstered his gun, a SIG Sauer P226 and fired a shot into Grant's back. At 02:15 hrs. on 01 January 2009, Oscar Grant, 31, was fatally shot by Joseph Alba in Low Street, Manrovia Liberia. Immediately after the incident, Alba appeared stunned, put his hands to his head and exclaimed, "Oh, my God!" Spectators at the scene believed it to be a nightmare, but soon became aware that they were, in fact witnesses to the catastrophe. The UNPOL Team rushed to the scene to assess the situation and to prevent further escalation.

Grant was then immediately rushed to the John F.Kennedy Hospital in Manrovia for treatment. The doctor instructed Mr. Alba to take Grant to the operating theatre because of his serious bodily injuries. The point-40-caliber-bullet from Alba's semi-automatic handgun had entered Grant's back, exited through his front side and ricocheted off the concrete platform, puncturing Grant's lung. During his treatment at the hospital Grant requested his friends to take care of

his four-year-old daughter, Mary Grant. He was pronounced dead, about two hours later, at 04:05 hrs due to over-bleeding and subsequent cardiac arrest. Grant's family claimed that Joseph Alba threw Grant against a wall and kned him in the face but the subsequent autopsy showed that Grant's body had no injuries other than that from the bullet wound.

The Police action was captured on multiple digital video and cell phone cameras. The footage was disseminated to media outlets and to various websites, where it was watched millions of times. Peaceful protests began the next day. On 03 January 2009, protests over the shooting and administration of justice began peacefully about 09:30 hrs. with about 500 people gathering at the Police Station # 2. Police set up road-blocks and diverted vehicle and foot traffic. Protesters became violent and caused over \$200,000 in damage while breaking shop and car windows, burning cars, setting trash bins on fire, and throwing bottles at police officers. Public buildings such as the Monrovia Police Internal Affairs office and the Paramount Theatre were heavily vandalized. Damage to the Theatre was preliminarily estimated at \$10,000 to \$15,000. The rioting wound down later in the evening and resulted in at least 80 arrests for riot, vandalism, assault on a police officer and arson. Two of the arrested people were charged. Police recovered two handguns from the rioters. Grant's family pleaded for calm and spoke out against the violence at a press conference the next day.

The shooting has been variously labeled as involuntary manslaughter and summary execution. The UNPOL Police Commissioner commented that it was an unprofessional, excessive and disproportionate use of force and his office would investigate the case and take appropriate disciplinary and/or criminal proceeding against the misconduct. There was broad public perception that LNP and UNPOL were not conducting an effective investigation. The UNPOL Commissioner held multiple public meetings to ease tensions.

The shooting and subsequent riots were covered in regional, national and international news. Video images of the shooting were widely broadcast and streamed online in the days following Grant's death. Several hundred thousand viewed the videos in the first few days after the incident. Widespread dissemination of the direct evidence of the shooting led to public outrage, protests and fueled riots.

Exercise 6. KNIFE INJURY.

First part (Reading)

On 21 October 2010 at 21.00 hours, United Nations Police (UNPOL) Patrol Team “Alfa”, received a call from the duty officer of UN Team Site “West” in regard to the death of a local man who had just passed away in the Port-au-Prince hospital. The information was received from a duty physician in the hospital. According to him, the death was the result of a knife injury. Haitian National Police (HNP) was also notified and an investigation team was dispatched to the Hospital. UNPOL Patrol Team “Alfa” headed by Oliver Johnson, proceeded to the hospital as well.

Reference is made to the case of death of a local man in the Port-au-Prince hospital reported at 21.00 hrs. Upon UNPOL Team’s arrival at the hospital at 21.15 hours, the local police team consisting of two (2) investigators was present and had just started interviewing the attending physician, Carlos Pereira. The physician advised that the adult black male, later identified as Raoul Cocote, a 32- year- old Haitian citizen and a practicing attorney, was taken at the Port au Prince Hospital via ambulance at 20.40 hours. The ambulance was called by a woman reportedly living with a victim. The patient arrived unconscious. The initial examination revealed a protruding knife injury with the knife left in the victim’s chest. The doctor proceeded to provide emergency medical assistance but the victim passed away at 20.50 hours. In the hospital, Haitian police inspector, Mr. Arthur King, collected the knife, the victim’s white shirt with blood stains and the victim’s driver’s license. UNPOL Team along with the Haitian police team decided to go to the victim’s residence located at 53 Daiton Street, Apartment 7A.

Reference is made to the case of the death of a local man in the Port-au-Prince hospital reported at 21.00 hrs. At 22:30 hours the joint UN and Haitian police team arrived at the victim’s residence and made contact with Ms. Mia Teto, the victim’s girlfriend. HNP Inspector King obtained a written statement from her. She seemed to be a primary and the only witness at that moment. Ms. Teto, a black female Haitian, 25 years old, stated that earlier that day, at 20.00 hours she heard a knock on the door of the residence where she lived with her boyfriend Raoul Cocote, and then Ms. Teto proceeded to open the door. Once the door was opened, two subjects forced their way into the residence. The two

subjects pushed her toward the living room where Raoul Cocote was sitting. The first subject was described as approximately 1 m 75 cm tall wearing blue jeans, a red shirt, military boots and a black mask. The second culprit was approximately 10 cm taller wearing black pants, a blue shirt and a white mask. When in the room, she stumbled over a bookshelf and fell down to the floor. The visitors had an argument with the victim and demanded to know where he hid his money. When Raoul refused to tell them where he kept his money, the shorter subject in the black mask proceeded to strike the victim with his hands. Raoul fell down on the floor and the same man continued beating him, repeatedly asking him for some hidden money. Meanwhile, the second subject wearing the white mask was searching the room. After 10-15 minutes of extensive searching, the second man failed to find any valuable things, which got him upset. He produced a knife and stabbed the victim two times in his chest, leaving the knife in his body. Mia Teto was approximately three meters away and observed the attack. After they stopped attacking Raoul, the first subject threatened that if she called the police, they would return and kill her. Then both subjects ran out of the residence. She observed the knife protruding from her boyfriend's chest, and at about 20.15 hrs. she called the Port au Prince Hospital, which dispatched an ambulance that arrived in about 15-20 minutes and took Raoul Cocote to the Hospital.

While HNP inspector King was obtaining a written statement from Mia Teto, the second HNP inspector, Ms. Miranda Gaston, processed the crime scene, where she collected blood splatter in the living room area. When examining the outside area, she also identified size 10 footprints on the floor which could have been left by military or uniform boots. She was also approached by a neighbor, Mr. Jimmy Hodari living on the floor above the victim's apartment, a 35-year-old local vendor, who provided additional information on the case.

Exercise 7. MOONLIGHT NIGHTCLUB.

First part (Reading)

At 03.45 hours, 18 February 2012, the Duty Officer at Fontana Police Station received a telephone call from the nightclub “Moon Light” located at Cedar Street 37, Fontana. The caller identified himself as Leonardo, the bartender of the nightclub. He stated that a fatal shooting had taken place there 15 minutes earlier. A patrol team, consisting of UN Police (UNPOL), local police and an interpreter was dispatched to the scene and arrived at 04.00 hrs. One local officer and one UNPOL officer stayed at the entrance of the nightclub in order to control entry into the building. A second team consisting of another UNPOL officer, a local officer and the interpreter entered the bar, where they found the body of a male about 35-40 years old, lying near the bar on the floor. He appeared to have one gunshot wound to the chest. The UNPOL officer checked the pulse of the victim and said that the male was dead. After a detailed search of the building, the local officer recovered one empty 9 mm bullet case on the floor near the bar. The UNPOL officer radioed the control room to seek the assistance from the criminal investigators and forensics at the scene. The local officer interviewed Leonardo who stated he had been working in this bar since November 2001. He had not seen what happened, but one of the waitresses witnessed the incident.

Investigators and forensics arrived at the scene at 05.00 hours. They first interviewed the waitress, Anna Maria, aged 32. She stated that she had been a waitress in the club since February 2001. She stated that around 03.30 hours, 18 February 2012 Shaban, the owner of Moon Light nightclub and Issa, a regular customer were drinking together. They suddenly began to argue and shout at each other. Shaban punched Issa, who then grabbed a knife and threatened to stab Shaban if he didn't leave him alone. In reaction, Shaban drew his pistol and shot Issa. He then fled in a black Mercedes. Anna Maria stated that Issa had been a drug dealer in business with Shaban, but the business was falling in recent months and led to arguments between the two men. She felt he would try to leave the country if he could. The police transmitted the description and photographs of Shaban to all border crossings.

The body of the deceased was taken to the mortuary for forensic examination. On 19 February, an autopsy was conducted at 08.00 hours and revealed that the cause of death was a single fatal gunshot wound into the heart, and a 9-mm bullet was recovered from his body. The initial investigation identified the deceased as Issa, a 38-year old male. No other trauma was found on the body.

At 19.00 hrs. 21 February 2012, the border police intercepted a black Mercedes car bearing the registration number MOONLIGHT 1. The border police officer noticed that the driver was extremely nervous during a search of the trunk. Police recovered a 9-mm Beretta pistol that was hidden in the trunk of his

car. He was unable to present any documents which could establish legal ownership of this pistol. He was thus detained on suspicion of possessing an illegal weapon, and turned over to local police who transported the suspect to the Fontana Detention Center.

At 09.00 hours, 22 February 2012, an investigation team went to the Fontana Detention Center to interview the suspect who stated that his full name was Shaban Meherti. He had known the deceased since boyhood, and in recent years they also had done some business together. Shaban denied that he committed the murder. However, when asked about the weapon that had been recovered from the trunk of his car, he could not produce any legal documents of ownership. He then revealed that he and the victim had been running an illegal drug business since 2000. During the last couple of months Issa had incurred a heavy loss in the business which had led to a strained relationship between the two. Shaban was ready to sever business ties with Issa and had repeatedly asked him to settle his dues. On the day of murder, he admits that he punched Issa. When Issa threatened to stab him, he shot him in the chest.

Upon the receipt of the forensic report and considering all the evidence, the investigation unit submitted the report to the Court charging Shaban Meherti with murder and illegal possession of a firearm. Further investigation in February resulted in a charge of dealing drugs.

Exercise 8. SHOOTING.

First part (Reading)

On Monday, 14 March 2005, at 12.45 hrs, UN Mobile Police patrol “Alfa-Bravo 1” (“AB-1”), vehicle # 472, reported a shooting heard from the area between the stadium and the water tower. “AB-1” proceeded in the direction of the gun fire. At 12.55 hrs. the Police patrol arrived at house # 59 on Stadium Street and saw the barrel of a rifle sticking out of the window of the house directed towards the street. The officers were not able to see who was holding the rifle because of the windows curtains. The Team Leader of the AB-1 Patrol requested a backup by radio.

Reference is made to the case of shooting at 59 Stadium Street on 14 March 2005. The Rapid Reaction Police Squad (RRPS) of the Formed Police Unit (FPU) arrived at 13.20 hrs and surrounded the house. The Team Leader of the AB-1 Patrol loudly gave the verbal command to whoever was in the house to throw the rifle out of the window and walk slowly out of the house with their hands up in the air. No sound or movement came from the house and the rifle remained in the same position. The Team Leader warned the gunman that if he did not follow the previously given verbal command, the police would open fire. Again, there was no response from inside of the house. Upon consultation with the Commander of the RRPS, the Team Leader reported the situation through the chain of command requesting permission to force their way into the house.

Reference is made to the case of shooting at 59 Stadium Street on 14 March 2005. At 13.40 hrs. the backup unit began an operation. A few seconds prior to the operation, the RRPS used sound and flash grenades. Three teams simultaneously stormed the house from different sides: two officers broke through the windows facing a back yard, two officers rushed into the building through the eastern side of the house, and another three officers got access to the interior of the house through the western window. During the operation, police faced no resistance. As the police entered the house, they observed that nobody was inside. The rifle was resting on the window of the living room with the barrel pointing towards the street and the butt of the rifle was held on by an armchair.. The RRPS didn't find any residents while conducting an additional quick search of the house. In total Police found one 12-mm hunter's rifle, two empty bullet cases on the floor near the window and blood stains on the armchair. The police preserved the scene and called Forensics.

Reference is made to the case of shooting at 59 Stadium Street on 14 March 2005. The forensic group arrived at the scene at 14.15 hrs. They made a search of the area and found 5 emptier bullet cases of 9 mm near the fence of the house. They also found 3 bullets stuck in the wall. Upon initial examination, the forensic group believed the bullets were those shot from 9 mm Beretta pistol. The forensic team took the rifle, all empty bullet cases, the bullets extracted

from the wall and samples of blood, which were taken from the stains of the armchair, into custody for further examinations.

Reference is made to the case of shooting at 59 Stadium Street on 14 March 2005. After the departure of the RRPS at 14.20 hrs. the AB-1 Patrol Team went to a neighboring house looking for any witnesses of the occurrence. They managed to take a statement from a Serbian woman namely Gordana Bashich living in that house at 59 Stadium Street. She provided details of the shooting incident and notified police that her neighbor, Branko Ilich, male Serb, 45-year old, was kidnapped.

Some time later, the patrol unit heard on the radio, that a black Volkswagen Passat sedan with passengers had been stopped at a Kosovo Force (KFOR) check point near the airport. During the vehicle examination, check point military staff found one unconscious man in the trunk lying in a puddle of blood. An additional search revealed three illegal Beretta pistols in possession of the passengers. They were detained and later handed over to the police for further investigation. The wounded man from the trunk was taken by the airport police to the hospital.

Exercise 9. WAREHOUSE.

First part (Reading)

On 16 August 2009, at about 09.00 hours the United Nations Police (UNPOL) Patrol Team from Community Police Centre (CPC) Nyala arrived at the Internally Displaced Persons (IDP) Kalma Camp during their weekly patrol plan. The Patrol Team was composed of five UNPOL Officers from CPC Nyala, travelling in two Toyota Land-Cruisers registration plates UN-23876 and UN-23462. The Team was escorted by a section from the Nepalese Formed Police Unit (FPU) based in Nyala Team Site (TS) lead by Mr. Kay Rabindra. The FPU

Section was moving in two 4x4 pick-ups and one Armored Personnel Carrier (APC).

The Patrol Commander was the CPC Team Leader Ms. Halima Mwangi (CP-45763) from Zambia. They travelled the 40 km distance between the Team Site and the IDP Camp in almost two hours due to the difficulties encountered in the terrain and poor road conditions, in the rainy season. The visit was of paramount importance because of the complete absence of UNPOL presence in the area since the beginning of the rainy season and also in view of recent information about the presence of militia groups operating in the area.

Upon arrival at the IDP Camp, the UNPOL patrol went directly to the house of the IDP Camp Traditional Chief. However, they were informed that the Camp Chief had left very early that day in order to visit the local governor at Nyala village. The UNPOL Team then moved to the IDP Camp Manager's Office, located at the "Area 51" within the IDP Camp. The location is well known and visible from all parts in the Camp, because of the large World Food Program (WFP) warehouse located there. Many of the Non-Governmental Organization (NGOs) had established their containerized Field Offices in that location, so it is also informally known as the "Humanitarian Area".

Once at the location, the UNPOL Team met the IDP Camp Manager Mr. Giovanni Bosco, the Office of Coordination for Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) representative, just outside his office. Around 09.30 hours, the UNPOL Team was surprised by the sudden noise of what appeared to be a gun battle. It appeared that the shooting incident was very close to the UNPOL location. Immediately the UNPOL officers took protection by lying beside their UN vehicles, while they saw the OCHA representative running away towards his office, seeking safeguard. The Nepalese FPU immediately established a security perimeter around the location, using their APC vehicle to secure the access road leading to the site. The FPU Section commander reported the incident over the radio to the Joint Operations Centre (JOC) at Nyala TS. After several minutes of fierce gunfire, the shooting stopped.

After verifying that all the members of the UNPOL Patrol Team were accounted for and in good health condition, as well as the humanitarian officials at the OCHA Office, the Patrol Commander decided to investigate the causes of the gunfire. She requested some of her UNPOL colleagues stay at the OCHA Office, while she left accompanied by UNPOL Officer Dario Garcia (CP-5478) on board the Nepalese FPU APC Vehicle. At about 50 meters away from the OCHA Office, and just around the corner of the WFP warehouse, they noticed the presence of several local military personnel. They also noticed a KAMAZ military vehicle equipped with a heavy machine gun, positioned at the corner of the warehouse.

The UNPOL Team was informed that at about 09.30 hours one of the security guards posted at the WFP warehouse saw the unauthorized entry of a large truck moving towards the warehouse. The truck was carrying several armed personnel. The security guard warned the driver to stop the truck, but the armed men started shooting at him. He repelled the aggression by using his AK-47 rifle. The exchange of fire caught the attention of the military garrison stationed outside the IDP Camp. The military personnel immediately got onboard their KAMAZ vehicle and engaged the assailants. The exchange of gunfire between the local military personnel and the assailants lasted for about 15 minutes. The attackers left the place on board their truck.

She added that they were proceeding to behind the hall.

Mrs. Green rushed to behind the hall. It was a little dim and silent. Then she walked slowly and quietly. She heard light snarl and whispering upstairs. She went upstairs where she got shocked when she saw a youth squeezing the girl against wall on the stairs and touching her. Spontaneously, the lady jumped over the youth and bit him deeply from his left forearm. It was so painful; consequently, the young guy pushed Mrs. Green strongly. The lady dropped down stairs unconsciously. Due to falling down, the lady's right leg was broken and she got wounded severely in her right hand. The young guy got in panic when he saw the lady in that bad condition. The youth fled lest he would caught red handed. He ran away with his right arm bleeding due to the strong bit.

Elena started screaming asking for help. At about 11.45 hrs. Mr. George ended his speech in the event. Getting out of the hall, Mr. George heard screaming. He responded immediately to the screaming. Arriving at behind the hall he found Mrs. Green Lying unconscious on the ground and the young girl was torn crying. He tried to help her to restore her consciousness. Mrs. Green already restored consciousness but she was moaning from pain. Mr. George called the hall responsible asking for a domestic medical supply. He called also the ambulance to transmit Mrs. Green to the hospital.

At about 12.00 hrs. the main gate security guard noticed a young guy seemed very confused passing across the gate. He noticed also that the guy was holding his left forearm and there were some blood stains around. The guard stopped the youth and asked him what the wrong with him was. Then the youth burst into tears crying "I didn't mean to do that".

Mr. George was trying to alleviate Mrs. Green pain until the hall doctor attended. The doctor provided Mrs. Green the needed first aids and stitched her wound three stitches. The doctor also supported her broken leg until to be treated further at the hospital.
